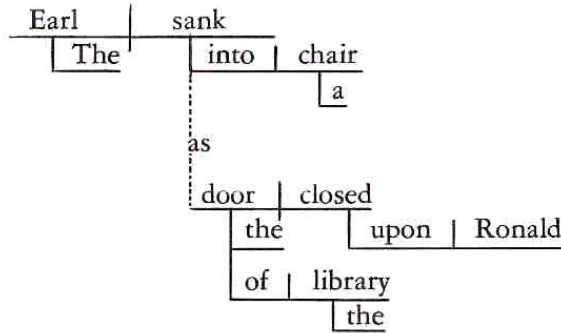
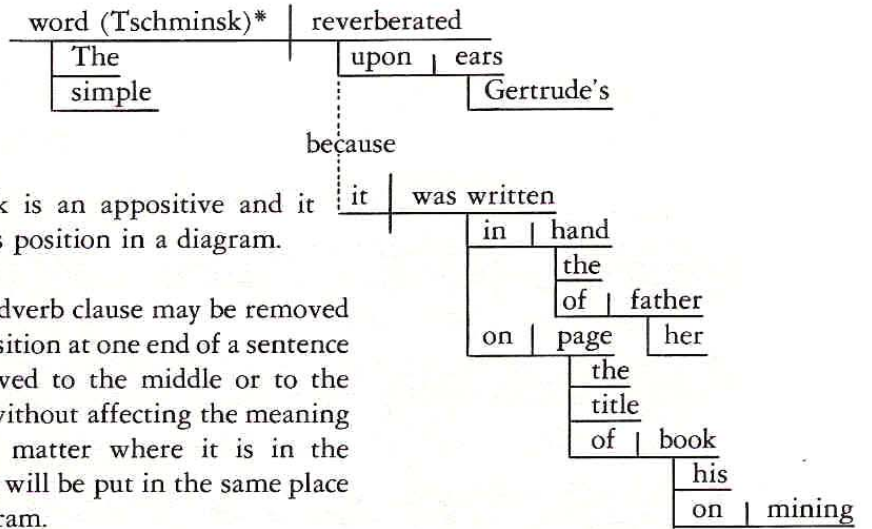


Diagramming adverb clauses

1. *The Earl sank into a chair as the door of the library closed upon Ronald.*



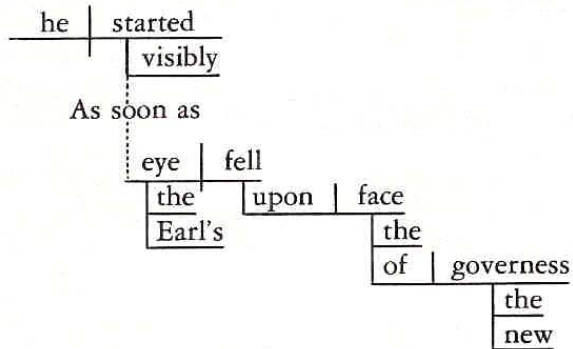
2. *The simple word Tschminsk reverberated upon Gertrude's ears because it was written in the hand of her father on the title page of his book on mining.*



*Tschminsk is an appositive and it goes in this position in a diagram.

Note: An adverb clause may be removed from its position at one end of a sentence and be moved to the middle or to the other end without affecting the meaning at all. No matter where it is in the sentence, it will be put in the same place in the diagram.

3. *As soon as the Earl's eye fell upon the face of the new governess, he started visibly.*
